Classification and Treatment of Post-traumatic Stress Symptomatology in Children and Adolescents

Joint Research being undertaken by Eastern Health CAMHS and Deakin University

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Aims of the Research

- To develop and implement an efficacious treatment for child and adolescent trauma victims using a group therapy approach
- Using Terr's conceptualisation of trauma, determine if different trauma "types" can be differentiated between by symptom presentation
- Investigate whether there is a different pattern of response to treatment dependant on trauma "type"
- Manualise the treatment so that it can remain available to Eastern Health clinicians as an adjunct to individual therapy approaches

Treatment Modules

- 4 Treatment modules are:
 - Sleep problems
 - Hyperarousal
 - Flashbacks/Repetitive Behaviour
 - Avoidance
- Each module consists of 3 sessions:
 - Session 1 psycho-educational information
 - Session 2 cognitive-behavioural treatment
 - Session 3 Review and Feedback session

Participants

- Children presenting to CAMHS for treatment after exposure to a traumatic event or suffering ongoing trauma
- Aged between 8 years and 16 years
- Receiving individual treatment and case management by Eastern Health Clinician
- Experiencing one or more of the symptoms being focused on by the research
- Deemed suitable for group therapy by treating clinician

Treatment Groups

- Randomly allocated to treatment groups (8-12years, and 13-16 years)
- Ideally, children in groups will have experienced the same "type" of trauma (Type1, Type2, or X-over)
- No less than 3 members, no more than 8 members in "closed groups"
- Groups will be run on any campus of Eastern Health CAMHS most suitable for participants
- 2 facilitators for each group

Current Status of Research

- A comprehensive literature review has been prepared in the area
- Ethics approval has been granted by Eastern Health & Deakin University
- Development of the treatment manual is currently being undertaken
- Pilot group being formed
